

## **Our Campaign Goals**

- Continue Woods Park Tennis Center's comprehensive, inclusive court availability and programming, particularly for traditionally under-represented communities.
- Replace two indoor bubbles, which are in poor condition and have exceeded their life expectancy.
- Meet a growing demand for youth and adult programs in the community, which is near capacity or plateaued due to limited court availability.
- Provide ADA-compliant facilities and meet an increased demand for courts for wheelchair players.
- Provide community meeting space and additional viewing opportunities.
- Host regional and national clinics, which attract visitors, players and families to Lincoln.
- Strengthen Woods ability to host local and regional tournaments, LPS and parochial high school matches and practice time, other high school tournaments, Nebraska Wesleyan, Concordia and Doane collegiate matches, over 50 USTA Adult League teams, Madonna wheelchair lessons and tournaments and more than 1,400 junior lesson participants each year.

## Taking the Game to the Community!

"Taking the Game to the Community" is a \$5.6 million capital campaign to replace the aging bubbles and improve the facilities at Woods Park Tennis Center. An improved facility is needed to continue Woods Park Tennis Center's comprehensive, inclusive court availability and programming, particularly for traditionally under-represented communities.



## **Our Community Outreach**

- Provides opportunities to those who wouldn't normally have a chance to learn tennis.
- Youth programs have grown from 36 participants in 2008 to more than 1,400 in 2013, under the direction of Kevin Heim.
- Partnerships with LPS Community Learning Centers, Lincoln Parks and Recreation, nonprofit community centers, Madonna, Lighthouse and others.
- Free racquets have been given to more than 3,000 children who could not afford them or were first-time players.

#### **Proposed Improvements**

- 6 indoor courts as part of the new permanent structure and 3 additional outdoor courts for a total of 18 courts; 6 indoor and 12 outdoor lighted courts.
- Upper and lower level gallery viewing spaces for approximately 900 spectators.
- Flexible community space for after-school mentoring, study time, meetings, off-court training, special event rentals, etc.
- Expanded locker room space and restrooms for men and women.
- Additional office and storage space.
- Handicapped compatibility.
- New heating/cooling systems for increased efficiency and reduced utility costs.
- Enhanced landscaping that is part of the Woods Park Master Plan.
